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# PRESIDENT'S REPORT \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

Happy New Year! We have some very exciting things planned for 2011 in the Near Westside! Life at 353 Davis Street, our NWNA office is about to change as we know it! As 2010 came to an end we prepared for several new and ongoing endeavors in 2011.

The purchase and renovation of 355 Davis Street - currently vacant, this building is a four unit with 2 commercial and 2 residential spaces. This project will serve two purposes: 1. Renovation of the 2 upstairs apartments, which when rented will give us more unrestricted funds to be used for projects and programs. 2. Use of the commercial space for an architectural salvage shop.

Victorian Row Park (VRP) located at 362 W. Church Street will begin a transformation this year as a community garden with a groundbreaking in Spring 2011 and planting party with fruit trees, herbs, vegetables, flowers and Goji Berries. Volunteers will be needed to help plant and water in anticipation of a future harvest. The fruits and vegetables that are not consumed on site, can be sold, given to volunteers or sent to the Food Bank of the Southern Tier.

NWNA and Historic Elmira are collaborating on a historic preservation project involving the building most commonly known as "The Ritz". The current owner has agreed to sell the property along with the parking lot parcel to NWNA. Historic Elmira has been awarded a grant from the National Trust for Historic Preservation to conduct a feasibility study and has had the building cleaned out. Once NWNA takes title to the properties, which is scheduled for March 2011, our goal, working with Historic Elmira is to secure and stabilize the building to prevent further deterioration and to ultimately transfer the property to a responsible developer.

I would like to thank our members, both old and new for your continued and future support. Our heartfelt thanks to our dedicated staff, board of directors and the volunteers who work tirelessly to make our projects a success. Cheers to 2011!

## **2010**

The year in review

This past year, we continued to administer our Home Improvement programs throughout the City of Elmira. These programs are funded by New York State Affordable Housing Corporation (AHC) and New York State Housing Trust Fund Corporation (HOME). In addition to the two grant programs mentioned above, we also administered the Historic District Paint Program and a Rental Rehabilitation Program which are both funded through the proceeds from the sales of our past One House at a Time projects.

Following is the breakdown of funding, either directly from or leveraged by Near Westside's grant programs, that benefited property owners in Elmira in 2010.

moderate-income homebuyer or an investor who will rent to

low to moderate-income tenants. Our 2010 project, located at 362–364 W Gray Street, is the first rental project completed through this program. As with all projects, through a competitive bid process, this property has undergone substantial rehabilitation. NWNA will monitor the property and assist any future investor-owner for a period of 15 years.

### **Holiday Home Tour**

The Holiday Home Tour was once again a success. This year, the tour showcased 6 beautiful homes in and







around the Near Westside Historic District. The Historic Langdon Mansion which is now home to Community Arts of Elmira was also showcased.
