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# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Another great year for Near Westside!

I'm always amazed at what can be accomplished with a small group of committed folks working together for a cause. It was exactly that kind of group that originally formed the Near Westside Neighborhood Association almost 40 years ago! Here we are, still adapting to the needs of the community as time moves on, and collaborating to continue to make Elmira a great place to be.

This year we were able to complete our "One House at a Time" project at 355 Davis Street, right next to our office. There are two apartments upstairs, and downstairs is "Brackets & Door Knobs". This will be a place where people who are restoring their homes can find period appropriate pieces to do the work the right way. We will be selling architectural salvage items such as doors, moldings, and yes, brackets and door knobs.

The Clinton-Columbia Historic District was officially designated on the National Register of Historic Places in June, helping to highlight even more of Elmira's rich history.

This year we were able to capitalize on a number of partnerships. We continue to work very closely with Historic Elmira as we begin to work on the Richardson-Kennedy Preservation Project. Right now we are working with the project and design teams. You'll be seeing all kinds of activity over there really soon. We are also planning a community event in May, which is historic preservation month. It's been a couple of years since we've had a block party, and it seems like now is a good time for another one. We'll be working with Historic Elmira to put together a day of fun while showcasing what the neighborhood has to offer. We will soon have a new version of our walking tour map available, as well (yet another collaboration - this one with Historic Elmira and the Chamber of Commerce).

Of course, we will still be holding River Fest in June, Elmira Blooms in July, and our 32nd Holiday Home Tour in December. Our Victorian Row Park & Community Garden is continuing to grow. We've already enjoyed some apples off the trees!

With the ongoing support of the community we will be able to keep doing amazing things!

# 2015

The year in review

This past year, we continued to administer our affordable housing programs throughout the City of Elmira. These programs include owner-occupied and rental rehabilitation, a paint program, and an ADA accessibility program designed in partnership with CVAC. Following is the breakdown of funding, either directly from or leveraged by NWNA's programs, that benefited our neighborhoods in 2015:

#### "One House at a Time"

Our most recent project was completed using a combination of State (Urban Initiatives) and Federal (CHDO/HOME) funds. Extensive renovations were required to save this building. West Construction was awarded the job and Brian Westerfer and his crew made short order of the repairs despite numerous surprises. The completed project now features 2 beautifully renovated one-bedroom affordable housing apartments on the second floor, and an open concept first floor commercial space.





### **Richardson-Kennedy House Preservation Project**

2015 has involved a substantial amount of behind the scenes work to prepare bid specifications for the work at 359 West Church Street. Having received design approval from the State OPRHP and Local Historic Preservation Commission, we will be ready to go to bid in February. The work to be undertaken includes selective demolition, a new roof, and restoration/replacement of deteriorated wood trim and masonry chimneys.
